Beavers are the second largest gnawing animal in the world. They are able to live on land and in water. As the beaver goes under water, its nose and ears shut to keep the water out. They live in colonies, work together and mate for life. Their little ones learn to swim when they are just one month old.

Bears prepare all autumn for the long winter sleep. They eat about 40 kg of food every day and prepare a place to sleep among rocks or tree roots. Their babies are born midwinter and are just strong enough to crawl into position to nurse. When the mother bear wakes up in the spring, her baby is strong enough to follow her around.
